A9: GUIDE TO DISPLAYING INFO ON WHERE TO GET HELP

ACTION PLAN ITEM

Ensure your club displays the details for Gambling Help Online (**WWW.GAMBLINGHELPONLINE.ORG.AU**) and Gambling Helpline (1800 858 858) in appropriate areas (e.g. back of toilet door, club noticeboard, club website).

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

If someone at your club — a member, the parent of a junior player, a volunteer — is gambling at risky levels or being negatively affected by someone else's gambling, helping them get in touch with people they can talk to might be the first step in supporting them.

Free and confidential support is available, and your club can help people find it.

Because most gambling harm is invisible, it's likely you won't know who's affected. If information about where to get sports betting and gambling-related information and support is easily accessible, members are more likely to use it.

STEPS TO TAKE

- 1. Take a look at the Gambling Help Online and Helpline posters available on the HFTG COMMUNITY PROGRAM RESOURCES WEBPAGE.
- 2. Order some of **THE POSTERS** through your Here For The Game team member. They're free and will be posted you. The posters are also designed so you can also print them yourself, if you prefer.
- 3. Display the posters in prominent positions around the club.
- 4. Using the digital version of the posters, display the details for Gambling Help Online (WWW.GAMBLINGHELPONLINE.ORG.AU) and the Gambling Helpline (1800 858 858) prominently around the club. This could include on in-club TVs, social media platforms and club messaging channels, electronic scoreboards or digital advertising boards, and on the website.
- 5. Include a short item in the club newsletter about where people can get help for themselves or for others.
